Barts Health practice assessor and practice supervisor nomination award

Each year Barts Health presents an award to a key practice assessor, practice assessor, a practice supervisor and a placement area, who have contributed to promoting excellence in practice education and an outstanding contribution to high quality practice education.

If your key practice assessor, practice assessor, a practice supervisor and a placement area deserves this award, then complete the <u>nomination form</u>.



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Practice assessors (PAs)

A practice assessor is a registered nurse or midwife with the appropriate experience and on the same part of the NMC register as the student they will be assessing. Practice assessors' decisions are informed by feedback sought and received from practice supervisors. The practice assessor cannot be the practice supervisor and/or academic assessor for the same student. A practice assessor must undertake preparation for this role, which is currently being developed. A practice assessor must receive on-going support and training (annual update) to reflect and develop their role.

You must complete the e-learning, which can be found on the Barts Health moodle before attending the study day. Please ensure that you have your line manager's support before applying.

Key practice assessor (KPA) forums

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Elective Placements

Your programme/course may include the opportunity to do placements of your choice, often called electives.

An elective placement can be arranged to enable students studying to gain practice experience in other healthcare provider settings.

An elective placement is an exciting opportunity for students to plan and organise a period of learning in an area either not available locally, they have not been able to access during their training, or in an area where employment has been sought.

At Barts Health, we wish to make it easy for student to have the opportunity to experience our world-class organisation.

An elective can help you gain extra experience/skills for your CV, for example:

- organising your own placement can demonstrate proactivity, planning or negotiation skills Pre-placement COVID-19 requirements
- making sure you develop useful employability skills during the placement itself, for example, problem-solving, flexibility and resourcefulness.

At Barts Health, our placements will allow you to experience a variety of specialist areas. We cannot guarantee that you will be able to undertake specific skills, but you will be able to oversee experienced registered practitioners working in highly specialist areas and specialist roles. Placements can be between one and four weeks.

You have to be a least 18 years old to undertake an elective placement in Barts Health.
